We constructed traditional tipis for the children to sleep in and learn about their heritage. I planned activities, lead workshops, taught swimming lessons and became a certified lifeguard. When not at camp I participated in the community to better understand life on the reservation by meeting with elders and attending pow-wows, drum groups, rodeos and taco feeds. I was able to gain the trust of several elders who shared their beliefs and heritage with me. I witnessed the poverty within Cheyenne River and Pine Ridge reservation through coordinating a tour of various regions within their borders.
